Essay Competition on ICT and EDUCATION

Announcement of winners

The title of the essay competition for the **AYF Youth Award 2005** was ***“ICT and Education”***. This AYF Youth Award was started in 2004/2005 academic year. The aim of this contest was for the young people to elicit and disseminate their views on the needs and benefits of ICT and Education in Africa.

The 2005 essay competition attracted 193 papers/projects which were submitted by young people from different African countries and from the Diaspora. Each had a contribution as to how ICTs could help the young generation and their nations to create jobs and eradicate poverty, to improve their lives. The grading was based on the quality of the titles; Introductions; purposes; grammars; relevance; creativity; contents; pros & cons and conclusions of the papers/projects. The highest score was 91% and the lowest was 5%.
